The Service will also help those who want to find informal learning opportunities in their community, to gain new skills or further a personal interest. The Lifelong Learning Information Service is available in all public libraries across the State.

The Lifelong Learning Information Service complements Libraries Tasmania's direct support to adult learners through its Adult Literacy Service and other learning programs, and is another way Libraries Tasmania champions lifelong learning across the state.
